Dear Parents/Carers,

As we reach the end of another Half Term, I would like to take the opportunity to revisit our uniform expectations.

Uniform is an important part of a school's identity. It reinforces who we are as a community, creates equality and helps students to feel pride in their school. It also helps prepare students for life after school where many will have to dress smartly for or wear a uniform for work.

With a new half term ahead of us, whereby a Summer uniform is permitted, we believe it is time to clarify our expectations of uniform for parents/carers and students. Students will also be receiving these messages throughout assembly in our final week.

Our uniform policy is available on our website for further reference, but please see the guidance below:

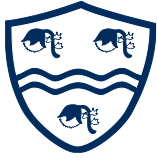
Skirts – Plain black, stitch down pleat (please ask uniform supplier for the official Darwen Vale skirt). **Please note an elasticated waist band, box pleat skirt is not acceptable.** As of August 2022, any purchased school skirt will feature our school badge which must be clearly visible at all times. **Waistbands must also be flat at all times.**



Socks – As the weather heats up in the Summer 2 Half Term students who are wearing a skirt are permitted to wear black, knee length socks. Students are not permitted to wear ankle socks, or socks with any ribbons or patterns. Any students choosing to wear socks must ensure they **always have their waistband flat**. Members of staff will be enforcing this, and your support at home in ensuring that this is not a difficult conversation is appreciated.

Tie – Official school tie must be always worn. Many students are currently missing a tie and will need to purchase a new tie over the May Half Term. Students in KS3 wear a blue tie, and students in KS4 wear a red tie.

Blazer and Jumper – Official school blazer must be worn at all times, as the weather heats up in Summer 2 Half Term students may remove their blazer in lessons and do not need to wear their jumper to school.



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Shoes – black leather or simulated leather, no branding and **no trainers**. Examples below:



Make up, false eyelashes, false nails, nail varnish or jewellery – must not be worn for school. Items of jewellery which are not in line with the policy will be confiscated. If ears are already pierced, only one small, plain gold or silver-coloured stud (no jewels) may be worn in each ear lobe. No other body piercing is allowed, e.g., nose studs, tongue piercings or other ear piercings. All studs should be removed for PE for health and safety purposes.

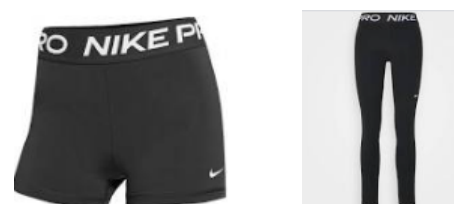
PE kit – The School Council recently designed a new Darwen Vale PE kit, which is more comfortable for students and cheaper for parents/carers. For Year 6 into Year 7 students this will be compulsory for September 2023. For existing students, they can continue to wear their current blue PE kit until they leave Darwen Vale High School. However, if existing students wish to purchase the new PE kit, or wear black shorts or tracksuit bottoms, they are more than welcome to. Going forwards, the only two items of PE kit which must be purchased from the approved uniform suppliers are the ¼ zip and the t-shirt which are shown in the images below. Students must then wear either black shorts or black tracksuit bottoms. **Not sports leggings, 'Nike Pro's' or cycling shorts of any kind.**

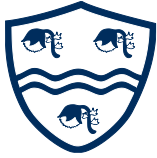


¼ zip

We will be enforcing the uniform policy when we return on Monday 5th June with zero tolerance of infringements. On the first day back, staff will check the uniform of all students at the gate and in the morning line up.

Any students not in the correct uniform will be asked to go home to correct the infringement where appropriate or be asked to borrow the correct uniform from our uniform store. Government guidance states that where there is a breach of the school uniform policy, either a headteacher – or someone authorised by the headteacher – can ask a student to go home to remedy the uniform breach. This is not an exclusion but an authorised absence unless the student continues to breach the policy to avoid school by being sent home or takes longer than necessary to make the change the students' absence may be counted as unauthorised absence.

We look forward to your support in ensuring all students are treated equally, present themselves fantastically in school and in the community and trust the guidance above makes things much clearer for everyone.
