# Transition from Primary School

We work hard to create an enjoyable learning environment here at Darwen Vale, but we know that a smooth transition from primary to secondary school is vital in order to give students the best possible start.

Our pastoral team work closely with primary school leaders to ensure every child experiences minimal stress and disruption during the transfer to secondary school. In doing so, we aim to make starting at Darwen Vale an exciting prospect for all students.

Taking time to visit our feeder Ppimary schools, ensures that we have detailed information on all our students before arriving at Vale.

We have developed a dedicated section of our website to transition, with video tours of the school, up-to-date letters and information about the school to support a seamless transition.

#### A smooth transition

We begin the transition process from an early stage in Year 6, ensuring that students who are planning to attend Darwen Vale receive the right level of support both before and during their time at our school.

All students are invited to the induction day, with bespoke transition visits available for more vulnerable learners, or those feeling nervous about the move. One-to-one meetings between pastoral staff from both schools makes this process a smooth one. As every student arrives with different abilities and skills, this gradual transition also gives us time to plan our curriculum to suit the needs of every student. By taking a tailored approach to education, we ensure everyone can achieve and progress.





# **Our Curriculum**

We are constantly reviewing our curriculum to ensure that it provides the best structure of learning for our students. We operate on a 25-period week, with hour long lessons. Our tutor time is 45 minutes and is used for the delivering of our Vale Values programme. This is our vehicle for teaching PSHE (Personal, Social, Health and Economic), Citizenship and statutory RSE.

This approach aims to secure outstanding engagement amongst students, and ultimately ensure that we can achieve great progress for all of our students. From a choice of 19, which include the subjects they studied earlier as well as business, media, sociology, ethics, sports science and textiles. The full range of subjects offered for GCSE is under continuous review.

#### Key Stage 3: Years 7, 8 and 9

In the first three years of their time at Darwen Vale, students are given a broad and balanced curriculum that opens their eyes to the full scope of learning available to them.

Our curriculum touchstones are as follows:

- An emphasis on the core subjects of English, maths and science. We must ensure that our students are literate, numerate and understand how the world around them works.
- A strong emphasis on an academic core including the English Baccalaureate (EBacc) subjects (English language and literature, maths, the sciences, geography or history, and a language) that develop cultural capital and prepare students for life in a modern democratic country.
- 3. A belief that the curriculum should be as broad as possible for as long as possible.
- 4. A commitment to giving students the opportunity to study the arts and technology

for as long as possible but with a commitment to allow students to personalise their diet as they move through the school.

- 5. To develop students' personal, social and health education including high quality careers advice and independent guidance.
- 6. To develop students' entrepreneurial skills and qualities.

A commitment to the arts (drama, music, dance), sport and computing is reflected throughout our curriculum. We have also increased lesson time for english, maths and science, laying the foundations for progression into Key Stage 4.

#### Key Stage 4: Years 10 and 11

We operate a 2 year Key Stage 4 and our year 10 and 11 students have an additional "period 6" three times a week to support them in their GCSE studies. We are committed to raising aspirations and ensuring that the school supports students to gain outstanding results in appropriate further qualifications.

Our core subjects include English, maths, science and PE; students also have a wide range of option choices, including full access to other English Baccalaureate qualifications in history, geography and modern foreign languages. Other option choices are more tailored to student's individual interests such as single sciences, business studies, art, photography and textiles.

We give students the opportunity to develop in both their core and option subjects. This aims to pave the way for a smooth transition to sixth form, college or careers.



# **Our Curriculum**

#### Science

We aim to develop all of our students into keen scientists, and we do this through an engaging curriculum and lots of additional enrichment. Trips, visits and project work is an integral part of science at Vale. Students can expect to receive visits from experienced scientists with different specialities. Other experiences include visits to Jodrell Bank, the Big Bang Fair and Science Live!

Alongside this, all KS3 students develop their communication skills through competing in the Science Fair and working towards their Bronze CREST awards. We offer a wide selection of afterschool clubs such as Science club and Astronomy club along with competing in local and national challenges which we encourage all students to get involved in.

#### Art

Outstanding achievements in art subjects come as no surprise given the expertise of our staff and the excellent facilities we have here at Vale. The purposebuilt ceramic studio with panoramic views over Darwen Moors, the specialist photography studio and open plan shop-floor area allow our students to experience a range of creative disciplines.

#### Design & Technology

In Design & Technology students embody the school values, creativity, determination, risk-taking, problem solving, all of which embed a passion for the subject. We are fortunate that in 2023 our curriculum can be delivered in our newly refurbished Design & Technology workshop and Textiles studio.

Here at Vale, we are inspiring the next generation of engineers, designers and chefs! Our students benefit in experiencing a curriculum that allows them to explore a multitude of material areas including new and emerging technologies such as CAD/CAM; 2D Design software, laser cutter, 3D scanner & 3D printer!

#### Business

We want to give our students the skills, expertise and entrepreneurial qualities they need to get ahead in the business world. Our students benefit from opportunities including a wide selection of local business links, entrepreneurial skills-based activities and visits to successful, well-known businesses. We are proud of the knowledge students develop that prepare them for life outside the classroom, such as budgeting and developing to product ideas The sporting facilities at Vale are amazing! Our students have benefited greatly from visits to Germany and Poland as part of a study into the Holocaust, Barcelona to support our language provisions and a range of local visits too.

#### Sport

At Darwen Vale we believe that Physical Education plays a vital role in the development of young individuals, and our department is dedicated to fostering a lifelong love for physical activity and healthy living. Our highly qualified and experienced staff are passionate about their subject. A comprehensive curriculum coupled with stateof-the-art facilities provide an environment for students to thrive. We also offer an outstanding enrichment and extra-curricular offering that offers students the chance to compete at regional, county and national standards.



# Literacy

At Darwen Vale High School, we believe that literacy is the foundation on which a child can build the foundation for academic success. We are dedicated to fostering a love for reading and providing our students with a rich literary environment. Our staunch commitment to a literacy rich learning environment is evident in the following aspects of our school:

1. Our school library with a dedicated librarian:

Our school boats a stunning library facility which is meticulously curated with a wide range of books to cater to the diverse interests and reading levels of all of our students. From Charlotte Brontë to Stan Lee, we have a book to peak our student's interests. Not only this, but our library has a lovely, warm and inviting environment as we have seamlessly integrated the charm of the old grammar school shelves with the clean, modern aesthetic you will see around our school. Guided by our dedicated librarian, this comforting atmosphere encourages our students to explore the wonders of literature and commence their reading journey at Vale.

#### 2. Reading for pleasure:

It is our firm belief that reading for pleasure is essential in developing fluent and lifelong readers. We ensure that every student, through years seven to ten, receive a dedicated form time of reading. During this time, students will have the opportunity to immerse themselves in captivating, diverse short stories, fascinating non-fiction pieces and engaging classical literature. Not only that, students in years seven and nine receive an additional hour a week lesson dedicated to reading! These lessons not only enrich a student's vocabulary and comprehension, but also provide a much-needed break that allows them to relax and enjoy the sheer pleasure of reading.

# 3. A Comprehensive reading intervention programme:

We understand that students may have different reading abilities and learning needs. To assess every student's individual needs, we perform comprehensive testing that allows us to analyse and target exactly what area our students need to develop. From this, our qualified and experienced reading intervention team work closely with students to foster their reading abilities and enhance their overall literacy development.

By embracing a holistic approach to literacy, we at Darwen Vale High School ensure that our students develop a deep appreciation for literature, strong reading skills and the ability to communicate effectively in all areas of life. We are of the strong conviction that every teacher is a teacher of reading, and every student is a reader.

# A Day at Darwen Vale

The Darwen Vale school day consists of five lessons, as well as tutor time and two breaks for breakfast and lunch.

Students go straight to tutor time at 8.30am. This 45 minute session is an integral part of our curriculum offer.

Year 10 & 11 have an additional 6th lesson on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday.

Our 25-period week with the additional 2.5 hours of tutor time provides students with more time to develop the knowledge, skills and understanding required for challenging national curriculum and GCSE syllabuses. The additional time also allows our staff to focus on assessment for learning, ensuring that students are given detailed, specific and focused feedback on how they can improve their work.

Our increased tutor period provides a focused opportunity to deliver distinct lessons on key topics. Form tutors deliver a programme that encompasses:

- Spiritual education
- Cultural education
- Moral educationSocial education

- British values
- SRE Sex & Relationships Education

# Personal Development

The development of the 'whole child' lies at the heart of everything we do. Our Personal Development curriculum is designed to create learners that are confident, resilient, and independent, who will continue to thrive in an ever-changing world beyond the gates of Darwen Vale High School.

#### Vale Values

The 'Vale Values' curriculum (which is inclusive of RSE, Citizenship, PHSE and British Values) is delivered by form tutors across the school. We also work with external providers who deliver workshops for students, which relate to the RSE and PHSE aspects of the curriculum. Curriculum content responds to the ever-changing and diverse needs of the local community and Department of Education statutory requirements. Our bespoke programme of study is based on three core themes; 'Relationships', 'Health and Wellbeing', and 'Living in the Wider World'. The 'Relationships' unit focuses specifically on the delivery of RSE, as do some of the more specialised units within 'Health and Wellbeing'. 'Citizenship', 'British Values 'and other aspects of PHSE are focused upon within the 'Living in the Wider World units'.

#### Extra-Curricular Clubs

A broad and varied extracurricular offer enriches the academic, moral, personal and spiritual development of our young people. We believe that through regular attendance at clubs, our students can develop their 'soft skills' that will enable them to become well rounded citizens. With over 25 clubs run weekly, either at lunchtime or after school, students can experience a genuine variety of enrichment activities run by subject experts. Our extra-curriculum offer allows students to engage with the community via social and environmental action projects that sit alongside their more traditional school subjects.

#### Trips

We believe passionately in 'learning beyond the classroom' and are proud of our comprehensive trips offer. These trips provide the opportunity for students to further develop their curriculum knowledge and understanding. For example, students in Year 9 studying the Holocaust in history can take part in a residential visit to Krakow where they can meet a Holocaust Survivor. Similarly, our trips to France and Italy are equally popular with our students, and indeed staff! As well as venturing overseas, many trips make use of resources on our doorstep. Examples from 2022-2023 include trips

to the Royal Opera House, UCLAN, Lego Museum, Palace Theatre Manchester to name but a few!

Darwen Vale has an active Student Council made up of representatives from every form who have been elected by their peers. The Council meets fortnightly on Friday lunchtimes with Mr Smalley to discuss matters arising that affect the student body. We also have an effective Ambassador Network. These students represent their school house or a specific subject.

#### -

We believe that education should pave the way to the real world, and focus on engaging students with the future from the start of their time at Darwen Vale. The Vale Values programme embeds employability into our curriculum, but we don't stop there.

A 'Go To Work Day' for students is designed to spark students' interest in their careers, something that we build on with enrichment activities and career sessions for all year groups. Our careers library and impartial, informative careers advice aim to broaden students' horizons, along with taster sessions to give them a glimpse of what to expect when they go on to further education or employment.

As students' progress into Key Stage 4, we offer visits to appropriate colleges, as well as University trips for the most able students. We also regularly bring alumni back to the school, to share their successes and leave students feeling inspired. In addition to this, each student receives a 1-1 careers meeting with an impartial Level 6 or higher trained Careers Advisor.

We ensure that our KS3 students (students in Year 7, 8 and 9) are exposed to a variety of different careers. We regularly have external speakers in from various local employers. These local links have been forged over a number of years. We have recently established a partnership with BAE who have kindly provided us with a new 3D printer for our Create Department.



# **Lessons for Life...**

Engagement, enjoyment and progress – these core principles guide our teaching and learning, and are at the heart of everything we do. Our students have access to a broad and balanced curriculum, designed to prepare them for the future.

All students are given the opportunity to take part in challenging activities both within and outside of the formal curriculum. Our teaching and learning brings the real world into the classroom, and takes the classroom out into the real world.



#### Aspiring for the best

Teaching and learning and a commitment to continually evaluating and adapting our practice is our core purpose. Our broad and balanced curriculum provides the framework to help students make progress, but it is our relentless focus on classroom practice that enables students to make great progress and our teaching staff to strive to continuously improve.

We aim for the highest standards across all aspects of our educational provision, from our cutting-edge facilities and bright, modern learning environment, to the continual professional development (CPD) activities staff undertake throughout the year

At Darwen Vale, we pride ourselves on the quality of our staff expertise. We build on this through dedicated training, including a teaching and learning research group that works throughout the academic year developing and sharing best practice throughout the school. All our staff participate in 1-1 coaching, observing each other teach on a weekly basis and providing practical strategies to improve pedagogy.



By collaborating with other schools within the Multi Academy Trust and drawing on the experience of the MAT central team, as well as local primaries, we are able to continually increase the capabilities of our staff, and with it the standard of our teaching and learning.

We believe that the explicit teaching of key skills such as our entrepreneurial qualities will help students become more rounded learners. We aim to instill in our students a passion for learning, the determination to stick at problems and the creativity to solve them, whilst teaching them to work in teams and take calculated risks in their learning. Here at Vale we have so many opportunities to share, explore and develop our passions. The staff are always here to push you further and help you to follow your dreams.


# Inclusion

At Vale, "We Care" and as such we see Darwen Vale as a team and a family. #TeamVale is something you will hear students and staff talk about. Like all the best families we take great care in looking after each other, providing a safe and happy learning environment where our students can thrive.

We recognise that not all children fall comfortably within the traditional education mould, which is why our pastoral system has been designed to make sure every student is cared for as an individual. The Universal Graduated Response is at the heart of our practice in supporting students who need that extra care and guidance when navigating towards the identification of SEND. We also offer various nurture provisions and other methods of alternative provision such as Aspire to support those students whose mental health can sometimes completely stop them from accessing education altogether.

Right from the outset our young people are welcomed into the school by a pastoral team consisting of a Head of Year, and Assistant Head of Year and Form Tutors. Students will be allocated into a house: Curie, Holmes, Shakespeare or Turing and they will belong to this House as part of their tutor group throughout their time at Darwen Vale. Students will generally maintain the same pastoral team, throughout years 7-11 with all Heads and Assistant Heads of year not having teaching commitments, meaning that they are available throughout the school day to support your child with pastoral concerns.

At Darwen Vale the welfare and personal development of students is discussed at our weekly PDBW meetings, which are led by the Vice Principal for Pastoral Development and the Director of Inclusion to ensure that no learning needs or reasonable adjustments to learning go unidentified, unnoticed or unsupported.







## **Endeavour**

Endeavour is a purpose-built area which aims to support students who would otherwise be referred to alternative provisions. Short term, tailored programmes in small groups enable students to build the skills necessary to be successful in a mainstream school, so that no child is left behind.

Students will access courses such as AQA Open Awards and outdoor education alongside the core curriculum before being prepared for reintegration to mainstream lessons. All students will be offered additional and ongoing support from the facilities within Learning Support from specialist SEND professionals.

Another crucial part of our Learning Support Provision exists within Aspire. Aspire was created with the most vulnerable students in mind whose attendance has been badly impacted on by poor mental health, anxiety and other factors that can harm a young person's attendance to school. Our dedicated team work closely with very small groups of students with the aim of gradually increasing their timetables on a fortnightly basis, until they are ready to fully reintegrate back into mainstream school.

# **Standards**

At Darwen Vale we insist on the highest standards for our learners. We uphold these by setting clear expectations of both ourselves and our students. In doing so, we aim to foster attributes in every student that promote their independence, strengthen our community and contribute to outstanding behaviour for learning. We call these standards 100%, and that's what we expect. 100% in terms of uniform, effort and attitude.

Darwen Vale operates a rewards system of earning 'House Points' and students are regularly given the opportunity to earn house points inside and outside of the classroom, and in the community. Students are regularly rewarded with Golden Tickets, Amazon Vouchers, Pin Badges and Rewards Trips at the end of each half term.

#### We expect our learners to:

- Show great listening skills to ensure they understand and can access learning in the classroom.
- Show a great attitude to learning by always trying ones best and playing an active role in lessons.
- Be equipped for learning.
- Have a positive and growth mindset.
- Treat others with the respect one would expect to receive.
- Treat the environment with respect.
- Behave in a manner that keeps themselves and others safe .
- Act appropriately outside of lesson times; eating in the dining areas, mobile phones are not permitted at Darwen Vale High School.
- Strive to adopt a healthy lifestyle, taking a full role in our extra-curricular programme, eating healthily and not bringing fizzy or sugary drinks to school.
- Show pride in our appearance by wearing impeccable uniform.

As part of the next step in your learning journey with Darwen Vale High School, we're very proud to now be able to offer you the very best of post-16 education, in the form of our newly-created Darwen Aldridge Sixth Form – fondly known as D6.

We are an ambitious and close-knit sixth form, which combines the very best of three Aldridge Education Darwen schools: Darwen Aldridge Community Academy; Darwen Vale High School; Darwen Aldridge Enterprise Studio.

In harnessing the knowledge and heritage of these three settings, we offer a high-quality and highly personalised learning experience for every student. The collaborative nature of D6 will see students based on the campus where most of their subjects are taught. Depending on the options and qualifications they have chosen, students will move between sites to take lessons at the campus which specialises in each subject - making the most of each sixth form's genuine expertise and teaching excellence. This will create a university-style approach to seminars and lectures, where students will move between campuses at breaktimes where needed. Where required, we'll of course assist with easy transport across Darwen at no cost to our students.









At D6, our students can choose from an extensive range of subjects and qualifications which will help them to get ahead. We provide A Level and BTEC qualifications which students can select to suit their personal strengths and interests, demonstrating to universities and employers both academic rigour and sound skills and knowledge. Students can also study the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), which is highly regarded by universities and other institutions. In addition, we support our learners to have the competitive advantage on their peers nationally through hands-on industry experience and engagement, alongside enrichment opportunities and strong pastoral support. That is because it's vital to us that our students get an all-round and enjoyable experience at D6: we believe that true learning and real success build on great classrooms and offer so much more beyond. Of course, we support students to achieve their desired qualifications; but we will also equip them with the life skills and entrepreneurial spirit to support ambitious next steps, and to live happy and fulfilling lives.

Making the transition from secondary school into post-16 education is a significant but exciting moment, and at D6, we will support you all the way through that journey.

# **Celebrating Success**

Our rewards system is built around the Aldridge Attributes. Students are given AA points for demonstrating Passion, Determination, Creativity, Teamwork, Risk Taking & Problem Solving. These are communicated to students and parents through Bromcom.
